SUGGESTIONS FROM THE JUDGES:

- Go Back in time to 1920, 1930 or 1940
- Write a short story about an experience a Saratoga Springs student may have had in that time period
- Think about topics you could write about:
 - a. Receiving good news or bad news;
 - b. Meeting a stranger from another state or country;
 - c. A unusual situation during summer vacation;
 - d. Or any other scenario that you may come up with.
